# Co-Creation Partner Support

Co-Creation may involve strategically understanding and connecting with partners who are currently involved in Triple P initiatives. Leveraging these partners into your ongoing work can be beneficial for building a community and/or coalition with a shared vision for Triple P.

This activity will prompt you to think about partners who are currently involved in your work as well as consider additional partners who may be important for sustainability.

For this activity, a "partner" is defined as any person having leadership or influence within the community. Partners could include directors/leaders of community organizations, parents, funders, champions for Triple P etc.

#### Follow these steps to create your "Partnership Net"



Using stick figures, draw yourself (as coordinators) in the middle of the white board/paper/chart paper



Identify partners or teams with whom you are currently connected. Spend time drawing these key partners/teams



Label each partner or AB team by name (ex: Media team, Data team, Susan at Smart Start)



Using arrows or lines, draw any connections between you and each partner/team



Using arrows or lines, draw connections between partners and teams



Create a "Waiting Room" by drawing a square!



Name/Draw any partners who would be beneficial to add to the partnership net in the "waiting room"

Consider partners who may have been involved previously with Triple P, champions, leaders with high involvement with children/families/sectors that are missing
